Course Description

From the moment we are born, our lives are shaped both by what we inherit from our biological parents and by the experiences we gain as we grow up. The examination of how we grow and change throughout our lifetime forms the foundation of developmental psychology. In this course, we will investigate physical, cognitive, and psychosocial development from infancy to late adulthood from a psychological perspective. Students should complete the course with a deeper understanding of key theories, research methods, and research findings on human development.

Intended Learning Outcomes (ILOs)

Upon completion of this course, students are expected to be able to do the following:

- 1. Apply existing knowledge in psychology to the field of human development.
- 2. Gain fundamental knowledge about how humans develop over the lifespan.
- 3. Gain insight into how developmental psychology research is conducted.
- 4. Learn about recent research relevant to developmental psychology.
- 5. Understand the current broader issues related to lifespan development.

1. Quizzes (30%) ILOs #1, #2, #3, #4, #5

 There are two quizzes to test your understanding of course materials. The quiz is an open-book, open-note quiz with a combination of multiple-choice questions, true or false questions, and short questions. The quizzes cover all materials in lectures and required readings. • No make-up quiz will be given to students who are absent from the quiz unless there are validated medical reasons. You must present a written note from your doctor attesting to the fact that you were too ill to attend the quiz. This note must be presented to me to arrange for a make-up quiz. The make-up quiz will be in the form of essay questions.

2. Self-Reflection Essay (35%) ILOs #1, #2, #3, #4, #5

You are to apply a concept learned in class to your personal experience. The concept should come from one of the following lecture topics: Cognitive Development, Moral Development or Friendship. Illustrate the concept of your choice through your personal experience with reference to what you have learned in lecture about the concept. The Self-Reflection Essay is due by **HKT 11am May 17, 2021**.

3. Group Project (35%) ILOs #1, #2, #3, #4, #5

You are required to work in a group of 5-7 people to organize a talk for parents to address a common issue about child or adolescent development. Your talk should be delivered in a way that gives parents useful information and recommendations based on empirical research. You have to deliver the talk in class followed by a Q&A session. You also have to design a take-home help kit that supplements the parenting talk. The group project is due by **HKT 11am May 3, 2021**.
